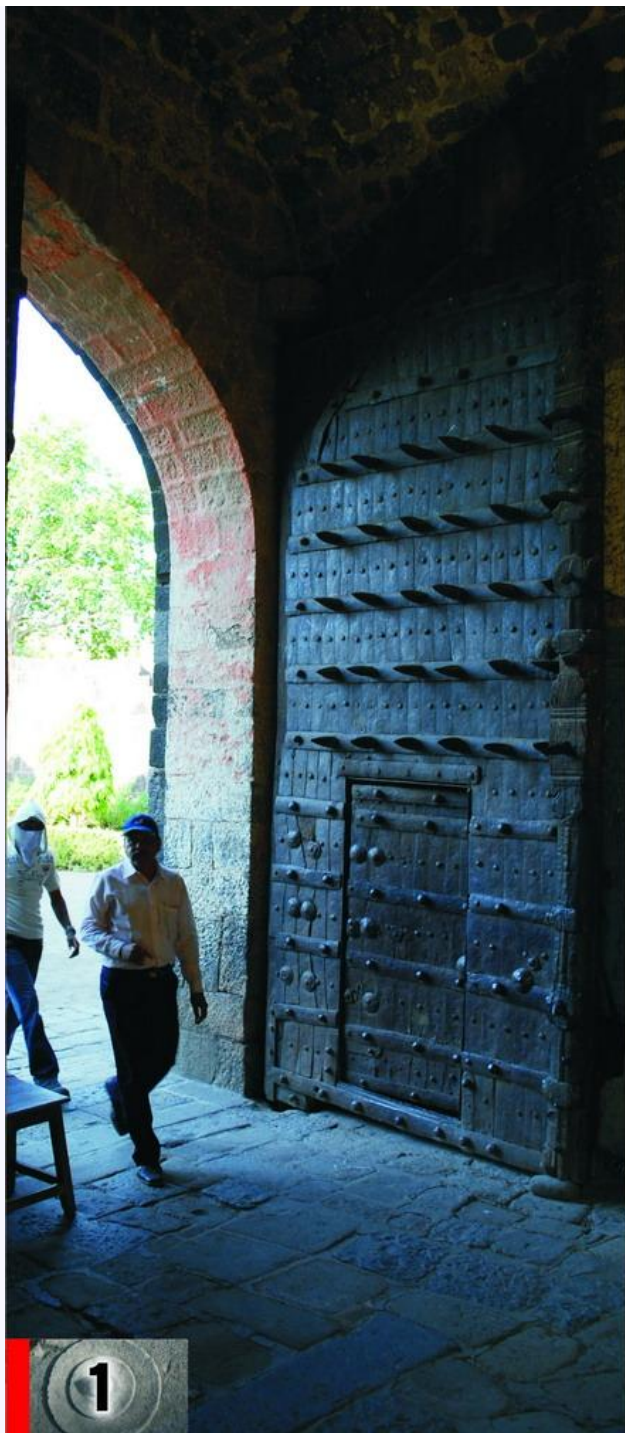

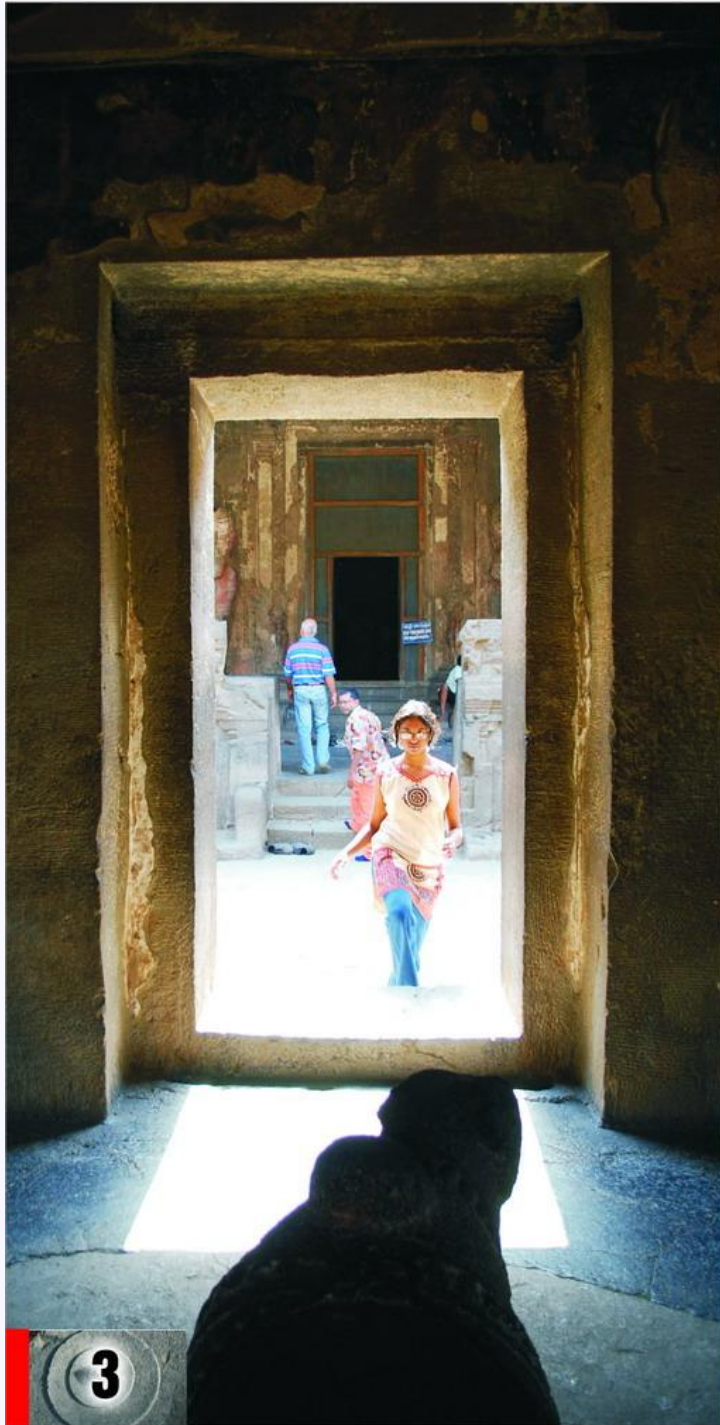

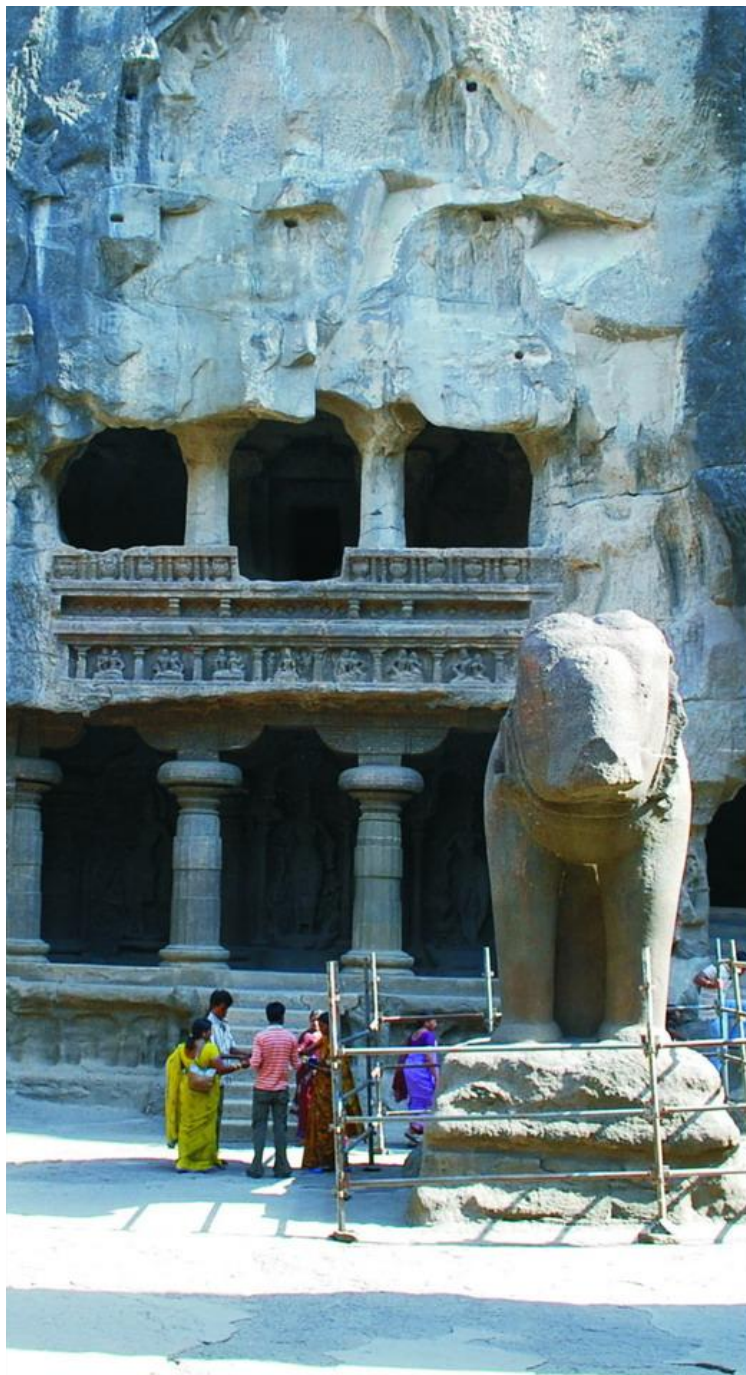

ABOUT AURANGABAD

The gateway to the World Heritage Sites of Ajanta and Ellora, has a long history of art and culture. Aurangabad is a modern city, which offers visitors all the comforts and amenities. It has several luxury and budget hotels, shopping malls, multiplexes, and hospitals. In the city are three museums housing the art treasures of the region the Sunheri Mahal Museum, the University Museum and the Chhatrapati Shivaji Museum.

Ajantha Ellora Caves

While the Ajantha caves are noted for their magnificent paintings, Ellora caves are famous as masterpieces of sculpture. The caves are not natural formation in the hill but each is a hand carved prayer hall belonging to different historical periods. Of the 34 caves in Ellora, 12 are Buddhist, 17 Hindu and 5 Jain Almost all the caves of Ellora are located near foothill. While the Ajanta caves are lying in the middle of a steep horse shoe shaped rock. Ellora caves are spread over a distance of three kms. The very big Kailasa Temple, cut out of solid rock, is really a wonder. Ellora and Ajantha are 28 km. and 106 km. away from Aurangabad respectively.

Panchakki

Built in 1695, this ingeniously built water mill was used to grind grain for pilgrims. The Panchakki (Literally meaning water mill) is famous for its underground water channel, which traverses more than 8 kms. from its source away in the mountains. The gardens, with several fountains, are a memorial to a Sufi saint.

Paithan

51 kms. South of Aurangabad, the looms of Paithan still weave the beautiful Paithani saris that are prized by women. The town is also famous for the Dnyaneshwar Udyan, which is the largest garden in Maharashtra, and a museum, which treasures a fascinating collection of art. The Jaikwadi Dam nearby is a bird watchers delight.

Ghrishneshwar Temple

Just half a kilometer from the Ellora caves is Ghrishneshwar Temple and is revered as a jyotirlinga manifestation of the great Lord Shiva's luminous energy in its lingam.

Bibi-ka-Maqbara

Designed as a replica of the famous Taj Mahal, the Bibi ka Maqbara is one of the finest examples of Mughal architecture in the Deccan. It was built in 1667, by Aurangzeb's son, in memory of his mother Begum Rabia Durani

Daulatabad

Originally this fort was known as Deogiri, a hill of gods. King Bhillam of Yadav dynasty had built this fort in 1187 A.D. the fort came under Khilji Sultanate of Delhi in 1318. This giant, majestic and imposing fort is built on an isolated pyramid shaped natural mountain peak. The rock around the fort has been chiseled so skillfully that climbing the fort was almost impossible.
